# <u>L&H Photographica Autumn Auction 2013 To Be Held on 17 Nov 2013</u> <u>Estimated valued over HK\$28 million</u>

**Hong Kong** – L&H Auction is delighted to announce the 2nd Photographica Auction will be held on the 17<sup>th</sup> November 2013, at Library and Lounge, Grand Hyatt Hotel Hong Kong. There are over 300 lots will be offered in the auction and generate a total auction value over HK\$28 million. Preview sessions are available from 9<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> November 2013. The renowned Leica researcher and historian, Mr. James L. Larger, is the consultant of the auction. Mr. Henry Chau, CEO of L&H Auction remarked, "The first L&H Auction completed with a Hammer price of HK\$23million in total. Attracted collectors from worldwide to participate in our auction and the hammer price were much higher than our estimated. It gives an impressive performance in Asia Pacific auction markets."

One of the highlight pieces in coming autumn auction is the early Leica MP Black Paint Camera (#MP-132) with Summicron-M 2/5cm (#1474804) Black Paint for MP. Leica early MP was initially custom-made for a very few professional photographers and reporters in 1957, with Leicavit in order to quickly shoot up to two frames per second. Only around 138 units of it were produced. This camera is made in original Black Paint. The estimated value is ranged from HK\$3million to HK\$4million.

Another highlighted piece is lot 59, M3 Betriebsk "UR-M5" Prototype. This is a rare original factory prototype M-camera with built-in TTL light meter. This camera represents one of the first units of prototyping of a built-in meter arm into Leica-M. Only a handful of those experimental units were completed, before the project turned into the M4/M5 development. As a set, complete with external display instrument built on basis of a Leicameter-MR, which connects to the camera with a plug and shows the value given from the camera's built-in meter. The camera's condition is nice. This camera set has been authenticated by Lars Netopil. This comes with a meter (MR) and body cap, in excellent condition. It is extremely rare and estimated value range from HK\$6million to HK\$8million

In this auction, Leica is the majority while other prestige brands will be offered. L&H Auction will present around 300 lots of classic cameras, lenses and related accessories to bid on.
